

SOO-RA-TUL-MAA-'OON

Chapter 107 Revealed in Mak-ka, 7 Verses

In the Name of Allaah, the All-Compassionate, the Most Merciful.

1. <u>A-ra-'ai-tal-la-zee yu-kaz-zi-bu-bid-deen</u> – Have you seen him who rejects the religion (Islam and consequently the Recompense),

Islam teaches a way of life, an ideology for the proper and dutiful conduct of life based on the Recompense and the consequent Awards or Rewards. Islam is a natural religion which can hardly be rejected by the learned and knowledgeful, having normal capacities of judgment and a sense of piety and justice. The Islamic concept of the "way of life" according to the Eminent Qur'aan is – "Undoubtedly, the (ideal) religion is Islam as approved and directed by Allaah."

2. <u>Fa-zaa-li-kal-la-zee yadu'-'ul-ya-teem</u> — That is he who drives the orphan away,

For if one believed in Islam and naturally in the Recompense of good and evil, he could not dare to push and turn away orphans.

- 3. <u>Wa-laa ya-huzh-zhu 'a-laa ta-'aa-mil-miskeen</u> and does not urge (others) towards feeding of the needy (much less to feed the needy himself).
- 4. <u>Fa-wai-lul-lil-mu-sal-leen</u> Woe to those praying ones –
- 5. <u>Al-la-zee-na-hum 'an sa-laa-ti-him saa-hoon</u> who are heedless in their prayers -
- 6. <u>Al-la-zee-na hum yu-raa-'oon</u> those who make a (mere) show (of piety),

7. Wa yam-na-'oo-nal-maa-'oon – and refuse (even a small help) to the needy. The above four Verses refer mainly to the hypocrites, who were worse than unbelievers. The 'small help' referred in Verse 7, includes house-hold articles such as common salt, water and fire etc.
