Chapter 110

Revealed in Ma-dee-nah, 3 Verses

In the Name of Allaah, the All-Compassionate, the Most Merciful.

- 1. <u>I-zaajaa-'a nas-rul-laa-hi wal-fat-hu</u> Where there comes Allah's Help and Victory,
- 2. <u>Wa-ra-ai-tan-naa-sa yad-khu-loo-na-fee-dee-nil-laa-hi af-waa-jaa</u> and you see men entering the (chosen and last) religion of Allaah (Islam) in large groups:
- 3. <u>Fa-sab-bih bi-ham-di Rab-bi-ka was-tagh-fir-hu in-na-hoo kaa-na taw-waa-baa</u> then glorify with praise of your Almighty-Lord, and seek His forgiveness (for all); surely He is the All-forgiving.

This refers to a prophecy for the Victory of Islam, which starts with the Victory of Mak-ka, when the people embraced Islam in large multitudes, tribe by tribe. It is reported that when this *Surah* was revealed Hazrat Abbas, *Razhiyal-la-hu-'anhu*, could not stop his tears – for it dawned to him that as the Mission of the Kind Prophet was almost completed and soon he may depart, high to the Heavens as the last Verse pointed out to Divine Forgiveness for all Muslims.

The unbelievers especially those of Mak-ka had in the past maltreated the Kind Prophet and the Muslims very badly and even attacked him in Madeenah. The Victory of Makka came without war. The Kind Prophet did not like to take revenge of their past cruelty and decided to forgive them. The people embraced Islam in large groups and were treated as brothers-in-faith. Hence the Kind Prophet was asked to seek His forgiveness, also for them for their past cruelties inflicted on the Kind Prophet and the Muslims.

In another place also the Eminent Qur'aan says: - (O Prophet) seek (His) Forgiveness for them.
